時參加屏東縣聲樂比賽獲得獨唱冠軍,繼而在全國獨 唱比賽中再度獲獎。高中畢業即考入中國文化學院音 樂系,師從楊海音教授,屢次在蕭茲博士指揮文化及 藝專的聯合演唱神劇中被選擔任女高音獨唱角色。大 四時被邀爲幸福唱片公司灌錄了台灣第一張世界名曲 集。同年獲美國猶他州楊百翰大學音樂系助教獎學金 ,隨即赴美深造。師事於Prof. John Holiday, Prof. Ray Arbizu。之後轉至內華達州隨美國名歌劇家Ted Puffer 學 習歌劇,以最高分成績獲得音樂碩士學位,曾於美國 大都會歌劇院西方區域比賽中獲獎,之後亦被邀爲美 國大都會歌劇院選拔賽的裁判之一。一九八〇年被聘 任爲内華達州立大學聲樂教授迄今。曾受邀至日本演 唱,並在日本及台灣電視台接受訪問及表演。一九八 七年在Poulenc的Gloria中擔任女高音獨唱於紐約林肯藝 術中心演出,同年受舊金山交響樂邀請於「歌劇之夜 」中擔任客席女高音,亦曾於著名的卡内基音樂廳中 擔任兩次的獨唱。一九九四年獲中國文化大學加州校 友會頒予「傑出校友獎」。一九九五年受台灣陳啓川 文教基金會及長谷建設之邀於高雄文化中心舉辦獨唱 會, 轟動一時。一九九六年於內華達州舉辦教授獨唱

會,曲目包括了九國語言。一九九九年十月於美國極

具歷史價值之派帕斯歌劇院重新開幕首演音樂會中, 李教授受邀演唱了幾首歌劇選曲亦被邀請在該歌劇院 的名人錄中簽名,成爲第一位在該歌劇院演出的華裔 女高音。

Professor Helen Lee

Helen Lee has just returned from her triumphant performance in Taiwan this past summer at Taiwan's National Concert Hall, and she was recently invited back to perform again last month.

By age 21, Helen had won a national singing competition, earned her music degree with honors in her home of Taiwan, soloed with the national Taiwan Symphony, and recorded several albums. After arriving in the United States for her postgraduate education, she won the Metropolitan Opera's district audition but chose to settle in Nevada with her husband, Richard Lee, and devote herself to her family, teaching, and performing.

In 1987, she soloed at Lincoln Center in New York and appeared as guest soloist with the San Francisco Chamber Orchestra. She also sang the leading role in Hadassah's production of the "King and I". Previously, Helen made her concert tour to Japan, sponsored by Suzuki Music Inc., where she appeared on national television. Locally, she has soloed with Reno Philharmonic, Reno Chamber Orchestra, UNR Concert Choir, and the Sierra Nevada Master Chorale.

Helen has soloed twice at Carnegie Hall with the Chorale. In 1996, she gave a concert in nine languages as part of a multicultural celebration held at University of Nevada, Reno. In 1997, on a nationally televised performance, Katarina Witt, the two-time Olympic gold medallist, skated to Helen Lee's live rendition of "O Holy Night".

Helen teaches on the faculty of the Music Department of the University of Nevada, Reno, and she is also the president of the UNR faculty's Honor Society for International Scholars. Helen and Richard have two children; their son Felix was one of the youngest graduates of Harvard Law School, and their daughter Eileen was also one of the youngest graduates of Columbia University receiving her Master's degree at 22.

★ FAPA GEORGIA CHAPTER NEWS ★

- 1. FAPA will celebrate 20th anniversary on January 13, 2001 in Taipei. More than 350 members and friends will participate the convention. It is not too late to register. Let us celebrate this unusual event together in Taipei.
- 2. FAPA 21th Annual Board Meeting was held on November 16-18 in Washington DC. Prof. Ming Chi Wu was elected as new President. The key speakers in the meeting were AIT Director Richard Bush and TECO Representative and Vice representative Mr. Chen and Dr. Lee. WHO, Taiwan for UN, Taiwan high-level visits, TESA and Taiwan self-determination are the major lobby issues in next year.
- 3. The House Committee on International relations passed HR 2739 on November 28. The Secretary of States is authorized (1) to initiate a United States plan to endorse and obtain observer status for Taiwan at the annual summit of the World Health Assembly in May 2002 in Geneva; and (2) to instruct the United States delegation to Geneva to implement that plan; (3) the Secretary of States shall submit a written report to the Congress not later than 14 days after the date of the enactment of this act. The Bill will go to the House floor for vote-shortly.

■ 台灣選舉

台灣選舉已經落幕了,結果也已知曉。立法院民 進黨大勝,成爲第一大黨,席次87;國民黨退居第二, 席次由原來的123席減到68席;親民黨獲得46席;台聯獲 得13席。獲票率,民進黨37%,國民黨31%,這說明了甚 麼?

第一、台灣人的意識慢慢在覺醒,大部份的人認同民進黨黨綱,尋求台灣的獨立自主。國民黨陳舊的最後統一論,慢慢爲人民所唾棄。

第二、台灣人選民素質也漸漸在提高。他們知道阿扁總統全力治國,卻由於所控制的國會席次太少,所有的議案,政策都遭遇到在野的黨外人士杯葛,而不能通過。他們知道問題癥結所在。該落選的,落選了。該當選的,當選了。

第三、李登輝前總統眞是了不起的人物。當任總統十二年,致力於台灣的本土化,提高台灣的國際地位。以八十五高齡,懷著滿腔愛國的熱忱,組織台聯,四處奔波,站台演講,終獲十三席,加上民進黨八十七席,總共是100席次,立法院總票數是225席次。雖然未過半數,但是只要再拉上13票就過半數了。台灣的前途大有可爲。

第四、新黨馮滬祥落選了。這位囂張跋扈,胡爲作 亂,勾通中國的一國二制論者落選了。大快人心。

台灣的問題仍然很多,外有中國的虎視眈眈,内有經濟的蕭條,資金外流,失業問題,生態破壞等等。現在選舉已結束了,希望在朝在野的人士以大體爲重,以民意爲旨歸,群策群力,運用智慧,集中力量共同來解決問題,爲人民造福,爲國家建設,爲立國奠基。如此一來人民可以享盡無疆的幸福。

台中縣議會議長顏清標,大家公認流氓地痞,最近因案被羈押,竟然當選立法委員。爲什麼?台灣人民應該反省思考。

王建瑄落選,光明磊落,祝賀當選人蘇貞昌,並宣佈從此退出政壇,將致力地方的公益事業,退而不退,值得敬仰.我們衷心祝福他。

2001大選揭曉:立法院民進黨最大黨,縣市長國民黨有斬獲 [記者施曉光/台北報導]

第五屆立法委員選舉暨民國九十年台閩地區縣市 長選舉結果昨晚揭曉。

在立法委員部分,民進黨繼取得中央政權後,進一步以奪下八十七席、得票率百分之三十六點五七,取得國會第一大黨地位。

至於原先的第一大黨國民黨則大幅滑落至六十八席,總得票率百分之三十一點二八,屈居第二。新成立的親民黨則是異軍突起,斬獲四十六席,總得票率百分之二十點三四。同樣也是新政黨的台灣團結聯盟,則是拿下十三席,得票率為百分之八點五〇。

至於力圖超越百分之五政黨得票門檻的新黨,只有一席,得票率僅百分之二點八六,終究難敵泡沫化命運。此外台灣吾黨以及無黨籍人士各當選一席與九席。

昨晚的選舉結果決定國會的新結構,更將牽動未來國內政局發展方向。除了新政黨親民黨、台聯崛起,勢必扮演影響政局的關鍵角色,過去國民黨掌握國會過半席次局面不再,取而代之的是主要三政黨都不過半,民進黨位居國內第一大黨地位。

在縣市長選舉部分,藍、綠執政版圖這次也發生 板塊變化。

雖然民進黨在立委選舉頗有斬獲,百里侯之役卻 崩盤失守,從北到南包括基隆市、桃園縣、新竹縣、 新竹市、台中市、台中縣等原本綠色執政縣市都失守 ,但拓展南投、彰化、嘉義三縣,因此,從原本十二 個執政版圖,剩下九個。

在總統大選重創的國民黨則在縣市長選舉大有斬 獲,自民進黨手中奪回六個縣市,但原先執政的外島 地區金門、連江則分別被新黨、親民黨攻陷,台東縣 也被親民黨奪下,連同彰化縣、嘉義縣失守,執政版 圖總數爲九個。親民黨奪下二席縣市長。泡沫化的新 黨則意外在金門縣拿下一席百里侯。另外嘉義市、苗 栗縣仍然維持無黨籍執政。

綜觀各政黨立委選舉結果,在應選一百六十八席的區域立委部分,國民黨這次提名九十七位候選人,僅當選四十九名,當選率百分之五十點五一;民進黨提名八十三人,當選六十九人,當選三十三人,當選上十二人,當選本百分之五十四點一〇;台聯黨提名三十九人,當選本百分之二十點五一;新黨提名三十二人,當選一人,當選率百分之三點一三。

在應選八席的原住民立委,國民黨當選四席,親 民黨當選二席,剩下二席分別爲無黨籍以及台灣吾黨 各一席。

在全國不分區立委的部分,總共應選四十一席, 各政黨依區域及原住民選舉總得票率,按比例分配席 次:國民黨獲得十三席,民進黨十五席,親民黨九席 ,台聯黨四席;在僑選立委部分,應選八席,各政黨 席次同樣也以總得票率爲分配依據,國民黨獲得二席 ,民進黨三席,親民黨二席,台聯黨一席。

第五屆立委當選人平均年齡爲四十八點七四歲, 若按教育程度分,博士四十八人、碩士七十三人、大 專八十五人、高中十二人,其他七人;在性別比例上,男性一百七十五人、女性五十人。

中選會將於七日前審定當選人名單,七日當天發布公告當選人名單,並函報行政院備查,十三日以前發給當選人證書,十七日以前發還候選人登記時所繳納的保證金,但區域、原住民選舉未當選人如果得票不足選罷法第三十八條第三項第二款規定票數,以及沒有當選的不分區、僑選立委候選人,都將不予發還。

中選會表示,依選罷法規定,區域、原住民立委候選人及縣市長候選人應於三十一日以前,檢同競選經費收支結算申報表,向各主辦之省(市)、縣(市)選委會申報競選經費收支結算。〈原載於自由時報〉

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Taiwan Election FAQ I. Legislative Election

How many seats are being decided in this election?

>> All 225 of them. The fifth Legislature will comprise 168 legislators from the special municipalities, counties, and cities in the Republic of China, four seats for members of plains Aborigine tribes and four for members of mountain Aborigine tribes, eight seats representing the

overseas Taiwanese community (i.e. ROC citizens residing abroad), and 41 at-large legislators. Each county and city must be represented by at least one directly elected legislator.

How are the overseas Taiwanese and at-large seats filled?

>> The political parties are given those seats to fill, based on their percentage of the vote. Thus, a party receiving 35 percent of the vote would be given a proportionate number of these seats.

How long are legislators elected for?

>> Three years.

Are there term limits?

>> No.

How many votes were cast in the two previous legislative elections, and what was voter turnout?

>> About two-thirds of eligible voters went to the polls in the last two legislative elections. In the 1995 election for the third Legislature, 67.65 percent of the 14,153,420 eligible voters cast their ballots. The 1998 election brought out 68.09 percent of that year's 14,961,930 voters.

What were the results of the last legislative election?

>> The Kuomintang won the most seats, with 46.43 percent of the vote; followed by the Democratic Progressive Party, 29.56 percent; and the New Party, 7.06 percent. Independent candidates and those from small parties gathered the remaining 16.95 percent of the vote. Comparison of the results of Taiwan's elections in 1998 and 2001:

II. County Magistrate & Mayoral Elections

What positions are up for election in the 2001 county magistrate and mayoral elections?

>> All county magistrate positions will be decided in this election. Most cities -- but not Taipei or Kaohsiung -- will choose their mayors.

What has voter turnout been like in previous mayoral and county magistrate elections?

>> In 1997, 11,809,277 people, or 65.92 percent of the eligible electorate, turned out. 1993 had a higher turnout of 70.68 percent, or 10.841.653 voters.

What were the results of the elections for county magistrates and city mayors in 1997?

>> The Democratic Progressive Party outperformed the previously dominant Kuomintang, taking 43.32 percent of the vote to the KMT's 42.12 percent. The New Party trailed far behind its rivals at 1.42 percent, while independents and members of other parties scored 13.14 percent.

How long do county magistrates and city mayors serve? >> Four years.

Are there term limits?

>> Yes. Unlike legislators, who have no term limits, county magistrates and mayors are limited to two terms in office. (The president is also limited to two four-year terms.)

Prospects bright for Taiwan, say analysts

More economy-related bills seen after DPP win 12/03/2001, by Lisa Wang, The Taiwan News

The decisive result of Taiwan's general election which made the ruling Democratic Progressive Party the largest in parliament, is likely to bring welcome relief to the island's gloomy economy, analysts said yesterday.

The DPP-led administration of President Chen Shui-bian can now work with parliamentary colleagues to push through bills to revive Taiwan's economy, which has sunk to a 26-year low, they said.

They predicted negotiation would replace the squabbling within a parliament previously controlled by the opposition Kuomintang which marred Chen's first 19 months in office.

"The ruling party will be able to implement its policies more smoothly with closer cooperation with parliament," said Wu Chung-shu, an economic researcher at the Academic Sinica, a prominent research institute in Taiwan.

"(President Chen's) administration is under tremendous pressure to turn around the economy, as it only has two more years in office to fix the problem.

"My guess is that it will waste no time in pushing for finance or economy related bills to bring the economy out of the woods," he said.

Howver, Hsu Chen-min, an economics professor at the National Taiwan University, also pointed out that "bridging the gap between ruling and opposition parties on economic issues" is crucial for the DPP to realize its plans.

"The DPP's success in convincing independent legislators to forge an alliance in the Legislature to form a dominant force is a key factor for the DPP's key economic policies, said Norman Yin, a banking and finance professor at National Chengchi University and newly elected People First Party legislator. Yin also said that "if the government does not do what it can to propose and implement long-term plans to help local industry development, there would be an exodus to China in the high-tech sector."

Roel Leuterio, deputy manager of the Research Institutional Sales Department at MasterLink Securities Corp. says that since none of the three main parties will hold the majority in the Legislature, the uncertainty that has plagued the Taiwan Weighted Stock Exchanged is over. "More investors will return to the markets," Leuterio said, adding that this will give the Taiex a small boost in the next few days.

Taiwan's Turn

The outcome of the parliamentary elections in Taiwan marks a watershed in the country's recent history and one that is likely to disturb the government in neighbouring mainland China. Beijing should resist the temptation to overreact.

The emergence of the Democratic Progressive party as the largest in parliament brings to an end more than 50 years' domination of the legislature by the Nationalist party founded by Chiang Kai-shek. The next coalition government will be one that does not automatically support reunification with the mainland but is associated instead with aspirations for Taiwanese in-dependence.

The lack of immediate condemnation from Beijing is reassuring, although it is still too early to assume that none will be forthcoming. But at least the victory of the DPP has not been greeted with the same sabrerattling from mainland China that met the election of President Chen Shui-bian last year.

The Taiwanese election was not fought on the basis of independence versus reunification, although many people voted according to their identity. A growing number of indigenous Taiwanese clearly reject the idea of being ruled by "mainlanders", whether they be nationalist or communist. That is a reality Beijing is going to have to learn to live with. Another reality is that economic and investment ties between the two entities are bringing them closer in practical terms, if not politically.

The priority for the DPP should be to form the broadest possible coalition, to provide a stable government capable of reviving the ailing Taiwanese economy and introducing overdue domestic reforms. Cleaning up bad loans in the financial sector and slimming the bloated state bureaucracy are both essential. Restructuring may be politically

difficult during a recession but the greater danger is that the burden of bad loans and in-efficient management could undermine rapid recovery.

China should be ready to deal with Mr Chen and his DPP. He has demonstrated pragmatic intent by relaxing restrictions on Taiwanese investment on the mainland. That now totals an estimated Dollars 60bn and provides jobs for about 3m Chinese workers. Such close ties make the Taiwanese more relaxed about the mainland, in contrast to ostentatious military exercises across the Taiwan Strait.

Washington's warmer relations with Beijing in the wake of September 11 should also encourage closer practical co-operation. There are going to be no quick fixes in Beijing's relations with Taipei but nor is there any need for ideological grandstanding.

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"Embrace Taiwan"

TAIPEI -- In Taiwan's legislative elections Saturday, it sure wasn't the
economy, stupid. Taiwan is enduring its worst economic contraction in a
half-century, with GDP falling at an annual rate of 4 percent last quarter.
Since the historic election of President Chen Shui-bian of the Democratic
Progressive Party in March 2000, Taiwan's stock market has declined by
more than 50 percent. Yet the DPP surprised most observers by winning
decisively, gaining 21 seats in the 225-seat legislature and supplanting
the Nationalists as the largest party. President Chen, frustrated by
opposition control of the legislature in his first year and a half, should be

able to find support for a working majority with the help of smaller

Saturday's results mark the completion of Taiwan's democratic revolution. The Nationalists, who had governed Taiwan for over a halfcentury (the first 40 years or so under martial law), collapsed on Saturday from 123 seats in the 1998 election to 67 seats in this one. The Nationalists had tried to mount a comeback from their defeat in last year's presidential election by running as the party of appeasement of. and eventual reunification with, mainland China. They claimed that Chen's pro-Taiwan-independence background was hurting Taiwan's economic prospects because of the hostility he engendered from the mainland. But the voters dramatically rejected the prospect of reunification in favor of (de facto, if not de jure) independence. China hands in Washington will desperately try to avoid the clear implications of this vote: America's one-China policy is dead. The citizens of Taiwan think of themselves as a free people separate from China, at least as long as China remains unfree. America has no reason any longer to claim otherwise. It has every reason to support the right of the peoples of Taiwan and China to determine their future relationship based on the principle of popular consent.

The "one China" policy is not only silly, it is dangerous. It can encourage Beijing to believe it can get away with bullying Taiwan, when in fact it is inconceivable that the United States would not come to the aid and defense of a fellow democracy. Last spring President Bush said the United States would do whatever it takes to defend Taiwan. The State Department tried to explain away the president's remark. After Saturday's elections, that remark simply states an obvious truth.

It's therefore time for American policy to adjust to the new reality in a way that helps preserve peace in the Pacific and that strengthens the forces of democracy. It's time to retire the doctrine of "strategic ambiguity" with respect to the defense of Taiwan in favor of an unequivocal commitment to its defense. It's also time to sell Taiwan the arms it needs so it can continue to defend itself and make the U.S. guarantee something that will never have to be invoked.

Nor is there any reason to continue treating Taiwan, a free and democratic republic of 23 million people, as some sort of pariah state. Taiwan's officials are not allowed to visit or meet with senior U.S. government officials. The secretary of state recently met with the first minister of Iran, one of the world's leading state sponsors of terrors—but he cannot shake hands with the foreign minister of Taiwan. This situation, a relic of the Cold War and of the claims of the previous authoritarian government in Taiwan to the right to rule China inconveniences Taiwan. It dishonors the United States.

Apart from the military threat from the mainland, the other great danger to Taiwan is that China will use the growing economic relationship between the two neighbors to undermine Taiwan's autonomy. The United States can play a greater role than it now does as an economic counterbalance to China by, for example, exploring the possibility of a free trade agreement with Taiwan. Our business community justifies trade with China on the grounds that it will lead, sometime in the future, to political liberalization. Increased trade with Taiwan defends a political liberalization that has already happened.

East Asia faces a choice between accommodating the rising power of China and deepening and expanding the democratization embraced by many of China's neighbors. The United States has an interest in helping to secure and strengthen the rising democracies -- not least because this could influence China's development in a liberal and democratic direction. It's therefore time to consider some sort of collective security arrangement among the Pacific democracies, with the United States at its center. Mainland China would complain that such a grouping would exclude it. There is, however, an easy answer to the rulers in Beijing: Embrace democracy.
